Last Raided Berlin.

Credited with four operational flights as pilot of a Halifax, Flt. Sgt. Jack Morton Jacob was posted missing Nov. 22, when his plane failed to return from a raid over Berlin. His parents, Mr. and Mrs. Frank Jacob, live at 79 Roxborough St. W.

The 22-year-old pilot trained at Toronto, Dunnville and Centralia, winning his wings last February. He left for overseas duty in March, 1943. Toronto born, he attended Rosedale School and Jarvis Collegiate. Before enlisting he was time-keeper at A. B. Ormsby Co., Ltd.

Mother Hopeful.

Word that her son, Sgt. George Baker Mould, had been reported missing on active service arrived on his 20th birthday, said Mrs. L. A. Mould, 44 Pendeen Ave., Mount Dennis. The young airman had been overseas just two months when posted missing. "We don't know any details, but are sure that he has every chance in the world," said his mother.

He trained at Souris, Trenton and Macdonald, Man., where he won his air gunner's wing. Born in Toronto, he attended Roseland School and graduated from York Memorial Collegiate. An older brother, Flt. Sgt. John Mould is also overseas with the R.C.A.F.

Instructor in West.

Pilot of a Halifax, FO. Desmond Robert Parke Short, 27, has been posted "missing," following operations over Frankfort, Nov. 25, according to information received by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. H. V. Short, 11 Empress Crescent. "The whole crew is missing, so we are very hopeful," said Mrs. Short last night.

Credited with more than 2,000 hours in the air, FO. Short was for some time instructing at an officers' instruction school at Calgary. In the service nearly four years, he won his wings in Saskatchewan. He flew a Halifax over from Dorval last May and has been on overseas duty since then.

Born in Toronto, he is a graduate of Parkdale Collegiate. A brother, Larry, is a leading signalman aboard a corvette.
